Muharramm/Hajra (Islamic New Year)	Thursday, July 29	 No preferred weight Animals should appear healthy

Navadurgara or Navatra Dashara or Dassai	Oct. 6 th – Oct. 14 th	 Females are not acceptable Tenderness is important Weights depend on individual buyer
Mawlid al Nabi (Prophet's Birthday)	Friday, October 7	No specific recommended size
