Eid al-Adha (Feast of the Sacrifice)	May 27 th	 Prefer yearlings (animals with one set of adult teeth) Blemish-free (no broken horns, no open wounds, no torn ears, no physical unsoundness) Prefer males to be intact, but would accept castrated males if no wound from the castration Large kids 60 - 100 lbs also in demand
Muharramm/Hajra (Islamic New Year)	Tuesday, June 16 th	 No preferred weight Animals should appear healthy

Mexico's Independence Day	Wednesday, September 16 th	 Milk-fed kids, "Cabrito", 20-35lbs (9-15kg) Larger animals for goat stew, "seco de chivo"
Dashain (Navaratri, Dussehra or Dashera)	October 11 - 18	 Females are not acceptable Tenderness is important Weights depend on individual buyer
Mawlid al Nabi (Prophet's Birthday)	Tuesday, August 25 th	No specific recommended size
Hanukkah/Chanukah	Dec. 5-12	Milk-fed kidsKosher processing desired
Christmas	Thursday, Dec. 25 th	 High demand for all goat meat Less than 50lbs (23kg) preferred
